Class text- How to find gold by Viviane Schwarz

Our children will explore our class story in a variety of ways including artwork, drama and role-play. They will respond to it in a range of ways and talk about the characters and events with increasing confidence.

The children will engage in oral storytelling and bookmaking as well as writing in role from more than one character's perspective.

Maths- Place value, addition and subtraction

Y1- We will identify and represent numbers in a variety of ways, count forwards and backwards to 20 and compare numbers. We will learn to understand, read and write the += symbols, learn number bonds and add/subtract 1 or 2 digit numbers to 20.

Y2- We will read and write numbers to 100, identify, represent and estimate numbers in a variety of ways and partition numbers into 10's and 1's. We will recall and use addition and subtraction facts to 20, derive facts to 100 and + and - numbers 1 or 2 digit numbers.

Science- Living things and their habitats

We will learn about a variety of habitats and the plants and animals that live there. We will learn to tell the difference between things that are living, dead and things that have never been alive. We will make observations of a local habitat and the creatures that live there.

Computing-IT around us

How is information technology being used for good in our lives? We will explore how IT benefits society in places such as shops, libraries, and hospitals. Whilst discussing the responsible use of technology, and how to make smart choices when using it.

PE- (Year 2) Multiskills The children will learn how to defend different games. They will develop their spatial awareness and dodging skills

Music- Pulse, rhythm and pitch
